Introduction

This toolkit provides you with an overview of the Care Certificate and how you, supported by your mentor/assessor, can use the materials provided to complete the theory which will underpin your practice.

How do I achieve the Care Certificate?

The Care Certificate was developed following Camilla Cavendish's review of health and social care support workers, and is designed to support care staff at the beginning of a career in care to develop the fundamentals for their roles.

The Care Certificate is made up of 15 standards that are applicable in both health and social care settings. The content within the standards is set at the level of a structured induction or mandatory training. It is not designed to be the only learning within your care role; it is the start of your learning journey. The Care Certificate is achieved by completing **both theory and applied practice** within a work environment, after being assessed by an occupationally competent assessor. How do I use these learning resources?

This e-learning programme is designed to be used by you and your mentor/assessor to help you to study the underpinning theoretical knowledge for each of the 15 Care Certificate standards. It uses a variety of methods including questioning, encouraging the review of national and local policy and reflective practice to help you to learn about each subject. The learning resources for each standard comprise an introduction, e-learning session(s) and a set of post-session questions. The e-learning sessions may vary in style but they all cover the theoretical learning outcomes for each standard.

Please note that some of the e-learning sessions within the Care Certificate programme are also part of statutory and mandatory training, available via the e-LfH Hub and ESR. If you have completed these before starting your learning for the Care Certificate, please advise your assessor.

What do I do after I have completed the e-learning session(s)?

When you have completed the e-learning session(s) you will be encouraged to complete reflections on your learning and answer the post-session questions for that standard. These will provide an opportunity to discuss your learning with your mentor/assessor and to clarify any issues you may have. You can get a certificate of completion for each course, from the e-LfH Hub, once all three elements in that course have been completed. You can save/print this certificate.

You will see this icon next to the course when the certificate is available:

If you have completed the course on ESR you will not be able to print a certificate; however you will have a transferable record of the e-learning and associated competencies in ESR, throughout your NHS career.

How do I apply the theory in my workplace?

Once you have completed the theory for each standard you need to apply your learning in practice. For a small number of standards, some elements will require simulation, e.g. basic life support, as the experience may not be available within your place of work. You will be able to apply the theory in your working day for most of the standards. It is not until you have practiced and been assessed in practice, that the standard is completed.

The Care Certificate cannot be achieved without practical application.
