Welcome to I Can, We Can

The 'I Can, We Can' project aims to improve employment outcomes for disabled young people, particularly those with learning disabilities, through supporting colleagues to understand the range of work that young people with additional needs can do.

Project Objective:

- Help NHS employers meet the training and development needs of staff /volunteers who are managing or working alongside disabled young people in the workplace;
- Support the creation of welcoming, inclusive organisational cultures within the NHS;
- Enhance understanding of what being an accessible workplace means (including environmental and attitudinal factors);
- Generate enthusiasm among NHS managers and staff for recruiting disabled young people into their workforce;
- Increase knowledge of the different support structures available to help employers and disabled young people find sustainable employment opportunities, with a focus on supported internships;
- Improve understanding of the social model of disability among the NHS workforce;
- Feature case studies that focus on disabled people over 18 years of age;
- Raise awareness of the wider Disability Matters curriculum, and increase update by signposting to existing sessions that organisations may find helpful e.g. Learning Disability, Autism, Inclusion Matters;
- Promote universal values and a common language across children and adult services;
