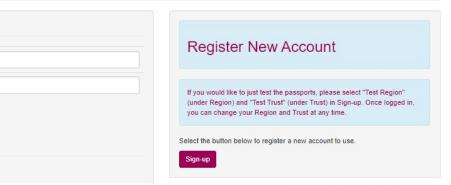

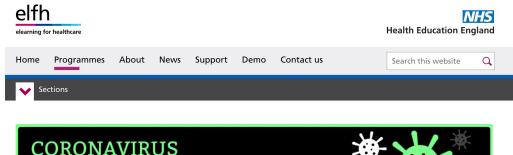

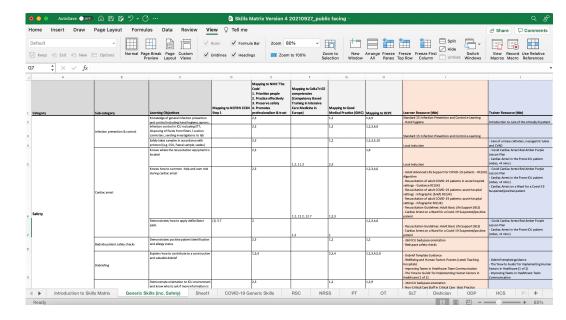
Skills matrix
